First semester lecturers



Malin Arvidsson, senior lecturer

My background is in History. I've explored the dilemmas that arise with reparations for past injustices. Tracing the process leading up to the enactment of two temporary Swedish laws on economic compensation for victims of involuntary sterilization and neglect and abuse in foster homes and orphanages. Since 2021, I am part of the cross-disciplinary project "Truth and Reconciliation in the Nordic countries". I will be teaching *Human Rights in the Global World*.



Olof Beckman, senior lecturer

I have a law degree and my doctoral thesis was in public international law. My research is in legal system conflicts, earlier I've focused my research on the use of military force in relations to human rights and human rights and water issues. My ongoing research is about international criminal law as an institution for the protection of human rights. I will be teaching *Human Rights in the Global World*.



Miia Halme-Tuomisaari, senior lecturer

I have a background is in social anthropology and critical international law. I research diverse aspects of the post-world war II human rights phenomenon, including how the conception of human rights has expanded and spread. Previously I've done ethnographic fieldwork at the UN Human Rights Committee and my current interests explore the intersection of human rights, climate change

and sustainability. I will be teaching Human Rights in the History of Politics and Philosophy.
